This past March, David Bergevin, Max Hailey, Mark Hall, Todd Browning, and I headed down to Antigua in the Caribbean for the Winds of Hell II semi-annual charter trip. We had all the gear needed for one of our typical charter trips: extreme foul weather gear, snow shoes, emergency beacon, survival kit, hack saw (in case of low bridges), beer and rum. However, we needed none of these items, except of course, the beverages.

We chartered with Sunsail from their base in English Harbor, Nelson Dockyard, Antigua. Nelson Dockyard was formerly the main British naval base in the Caribbean during the 1700's and has been restored as a national park complete with cobble stone roads, wood shingled roofs, old inns and taverns. It's really an interesting place if you get a chance to visit.

I will not bore you with a day to day journal of what happened, but every day followed the same general pattern: wake up, set sail, open beer, sail all day, find a place to anchor and repeat the following day. One day, we sailed within sight of an active volcano on another island, but with our record, we dared not venture too closely. We generally sailed around the island and anchored in different bays. Most nights we were able to take the dingy to shore for dinner and beverages.

Usually, the storms, waves, and sleet prevent good snorkeling. It was great.

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:06 P.M. by Commodore Matt Crawford.

2. Commodores Report by Matt Crawford:

4. Harbor Master Report – Richard Merrill reported that the dock is just about full with everyone in their right spots. Let him know of any problems. Richards stated that the base gave the ski club the old docks from the rec center and they are giving us two (2) of them. He will go get them soon and we should be able to have them up and running pretty quickly.

5. Port Captain Report – John Sanders reported that the new lawn mower is getting into the swing of things and the site looks great. He also thanked everyone who came out and helped to move the sand around on the beach. Report any problem with the site to him.

6. Communication – Web Page: John Garibotte reported that everything is okay with the website.

7. Jr. Sailing – Paul Stevens: Paul handed out a sheet with answers to many of the questions members had at the last meeting. One of the main concerns was the club's liability and insurance. Debi Merrill reported that the kids are covered but not the boats. Paul stated that he would like to give this a 3 year trial period to see how it works out with more program added each year. He would like the program to become self-sustaining eventually by the fees charged. He also stated that volunteers would be needed. This would be a very positive event towards base relations. Frank Steinle asked about having Jr. Memberships and Matt Crawford stated that maybe we can do that in the future. Lucian Cayce asked about the start-up money. Paul explained that fund raisers were in the works including a raffle, donations from local businesses and members. Sally Ranstrom asked about the time limit and Paul said that if not working after the trial period he would quit. Lucian Cayce asked if Paul had kids in mind to do this and he stated that of course his kids and their friends and many others had stated an interest. Kim Dolan asked about the Optis and if he was tied to getting them and Paul stated he wanted to start with them and grow into Sunfish, etc. Donna Cayce wanted to be sure that the program would be structured and Paul stated it would be something like 9-12 on Saturdays for 6 weeks. Paul made a motion that we okay the Jr. Sailing Committee to begin planning and fund-raising. Lucian Cayce seconded the motion. The motion carried. Paul's 2nd motion was that HYC provide seed money for the program in the amount of \$500.00 to be used for advertising, etc. to get things started. David Bergevin seconded the motion. The motion carried. Paul's proposal #3 was that HYC join the Optimist Association. Paul would like to attend a training seminar in Knoxville. Dixie Crawford seconded the motion. David Bergevin asked if there would be any conflict with any other associations the club belonged to and Paul responded no. The motion carried. Valerie Sanders reported that she has the raffle tickets for the first fund raiser where a beautiful quilt will be raffled off. Each ticket will be \$1.00 for a chance at the quilt. The raffle will be held the weekend of the C-15 Nationals.
